Crossing and placemaking:

Dimensions of transgression in the practice of Stalker / Osservatorio Nomade

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The word ‘transgression’ in its original sense has a performative meaning. Etymologically, *transgressus* signifies ‘to step across’, ‘to climb over’—in other words, the act of a body overcoming a physical boundary. It is precisely at this threshold where the practice of the Italian group of architects, artists and activists Stalker / Osservatorio Nomade originates. Since 1995, the group has been performing collective walks off-track through peripheral urban spaces, using barriers as passages, and in so doing, establishing connections regardless of public and private spheres and boundaries. What started as a hybrid between performance art and territorial research evolved a few years later into a more socially engaged practice. It shifted from this distinctly corporeal way of transgressing territories towards strategies of overcoming social confines relating to marginalised groups. Hence, instead of the heroic act of crossing, subtler means became crucial to overcome prejudice and fear and eventually to allow for transformations of precarious places. Nevertheless, their interventions—such as establishing a Kurdish cultural centre, a neighbourhood-based TV channel in a giant housing complex, or building a house in a Roma camp—all at some point came into conflict with official or unwritten rules. While their projects aimed at changing society for the better, they raise the question of whether such micro-utopias inevitably require transgressive acts.

Through analysis of Stalker’s practice, I aim to investigate, on the one hand, whether and how these two dimensions of transgression—the performative crossing and the utopian placemaking—interrelate. On the other hand, I intend to examine the extent to which transgression can be regarded as a value in and of itself in Stalker’s work, or whether it is merely a side-effect of underlying anarchist principles.
